NAPLAN

On Tuesday our Year 3 and 5 children received their NAPLAN results. We are very pleased with our results, which affirm the programs we have targeted over the past few years. We strive to always improve and acknowledge there is always room for improvement. Be assured we will continue to have discussions about individual children into term four and urge parents to make appointments if they are concerned about their child's results.

In a snapshot:

- Year 3 and Year 5 Reading results are above the state average.
- In Year 3 the school average in Writing, Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation results are above the National average.
- In Year 5 the school average in Writing, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation and Numeracy results are above the National average.
- The percentage of children in the top two bands has increased over the past four years from 20% to 42%. This target has well exceeded the Premier's Priority target.
- The growth from Year 3 (2017) to Year 5 (2019) has exceeded the state average across all domains.

We consider our school an integral part of our community where everyone plays a part in the education of a child. These wonderful results would not have been possible without your support! Thank you!
