#### TRANSITION INTO HIGH SCHOOL

Although it seems like a long way away, parents of Year 4 and Year 5 children now need to be considering high school options.

Just a reminder that high school enrolment forms (online preferred) will be expected to be completed at the <u>end of term one, 2025</u> for current Year 5 students (Year 6-2025). This will come around very quickly and parents of Year 4 and Year 5 students now need to be considering high school options and placements.

High school orientation days are typically held early next year, and I encourage parents of both Year 5 and Year 6 children (2025) to be looking at school websites and planning to attend those evening orientation sessions. A parent information session will be conducted early next year with more information.

## CHANGES TO OC & SELECTIVE SCHOOL PROCESSES

The Department of Education is implementing changes to the application and placement process for both selective high schools (SHS) and opportunity classes (OC) to deliver benefits for schools, students, parents and carers. Parents may now apply at the end of Year 3 (for Opportunity Classes) and the end of year 5 (for Selective High Schools) for 2026 entry. This is a longer application period for parents and carers to apply. Importantly, outcomes will be released earlier.

This means that the application period for both OC and SHS is now the same and will run from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025. Due to the longer application period, late applications won't be accepted. The 2025 test dates are from 2 to 4 May 2025 for 2026 entry. Students will need to attend one test date only.
