THE PLANETS

The eight planets

There are eight planets that travel around the Sun.

The closest planets are Mercury, Venus, Earth and Mars. These are the rocky planets.



DATE

The next four planets are Jupiter,

Saturn, Uranus and Neptune. They are the gas planets. Uranus and Neptune are the most far away from the Sun.

Earth

Earth is the third planet from the Sun. Earth is the planet that we live on. It is the only planet with air that we can breathe.

Mercury and Venus

Mercury and Venus are both made of rock.

Mercury is the closest planet to the Sun. It is covered in craters (holes).

Venus is the second planet from the Sun. Venus has many volcanoes.

Mars

Mars is a red planet made of rock. Winds on Mars cause huge dust storms.

Jupiter and Saturn

Jupiter and Saturn are huge, gas planets. Jupiter is the largest planet and it spins the fastest.

Uranus and Neptune

Uranus and Neptune are the outermost planets. Uranus and Neptune are blue planets.



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


