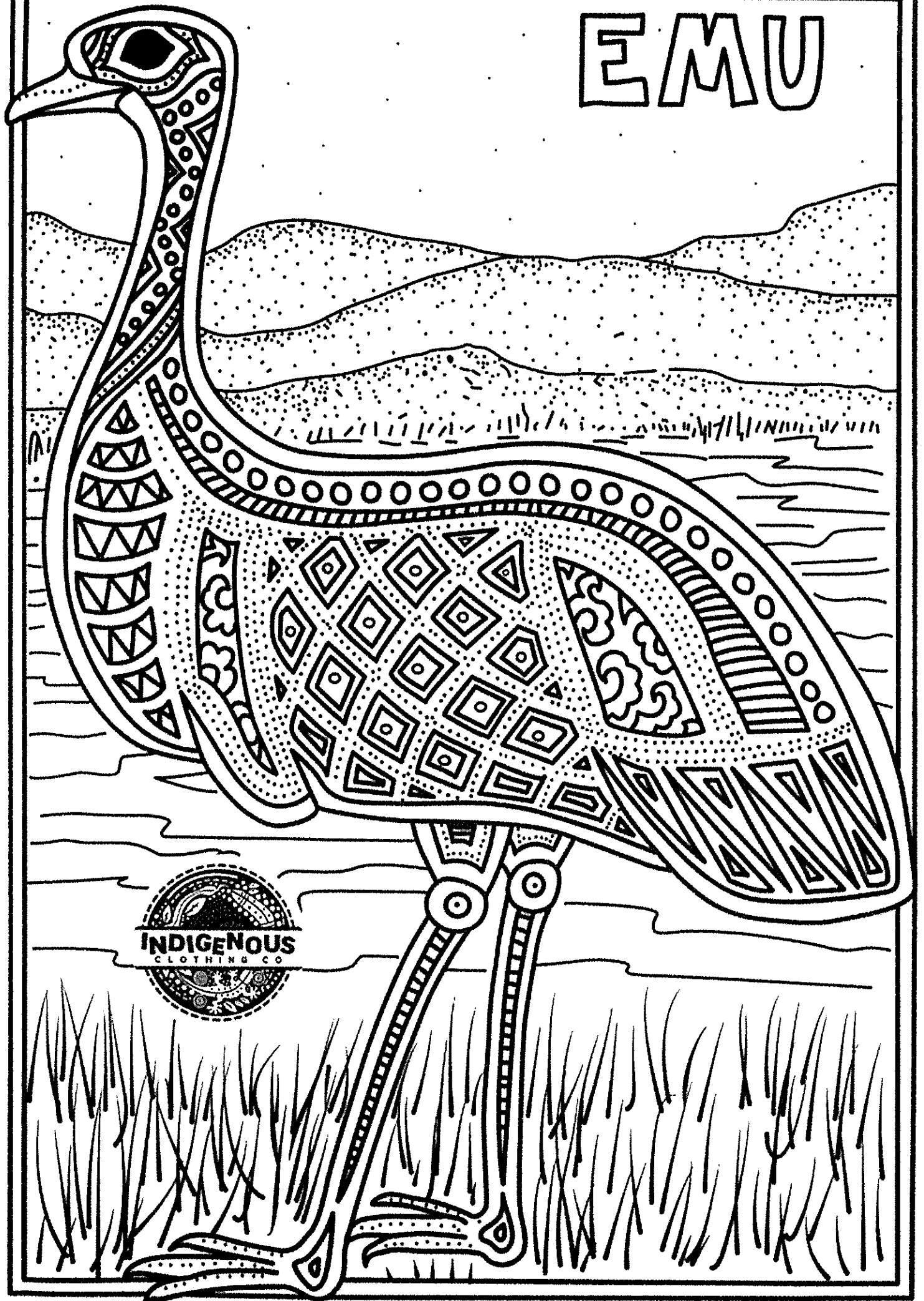

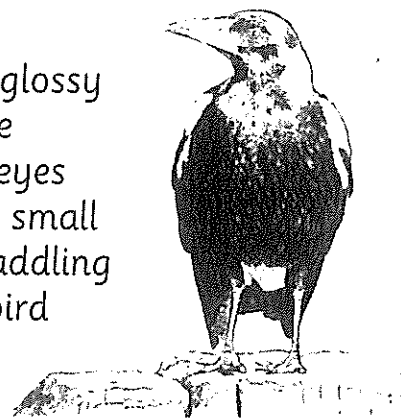

## PIED BEAUTY

Known and loved across Australia is the magpie, with its glossy black and white feathers and its familiar, musical call. The magpie is a medium-sized bird about 40cm in length. Its eyes are golden brown in colour and it has a strong bill with a small hook at the tip. It has long legs and walks rather than waddling or hopping. The magpie is closely related to the butcher bird which, although smaller, is also black and white and a beautiful songbird.



Magpies are ground feeders and are often seen in backyard gardens pacing about, searching for food. They dig into the earth with their strong bills or turn over rubbish in search of worms, snails and spiders as well as insects and their larvae – ants, beetles, moths and caterpillars. They also eat small animals such as frogs, mice and skinks.

Magpies breed in the spring. The female builds her nest high up in the fork of a tree. She lays between two and five oval-shaped eggs which are light blue or green. During the breeding season, some magpies may swoop on anyone who approaches their nest, especially bike riders.

Magpies are regarded as one of Australia's best songbirds with their enchanting, warbling notes and their carolling at dawn and dusk. Interestingly, the magpie can mimic the calls of many other birds as well as dogs and horses.

The magpie has become the emblem of many sporting teams, carrying with it the idea of boldness and confidence. These teams proudly wear uniforms with black and white stripes. Magpies, or maggies as they are fondly called, are welcomed at the back door of many an Australian home with a kind word and a scrap of food to eat.
