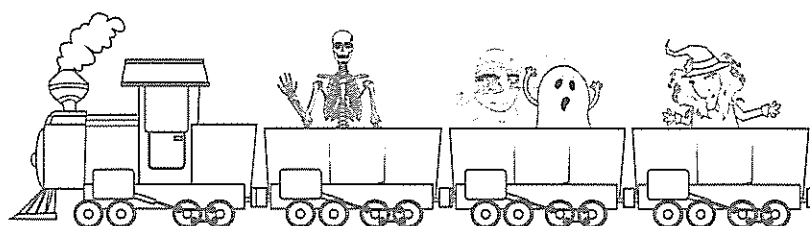
"Shhh..." Lachlan paused, "I can hear voices."

In conclusion, the dangers of smart phones in the classroom should not be ignored. For the sake of our children's education, we must ban smart phones from classrooms now and in the future.



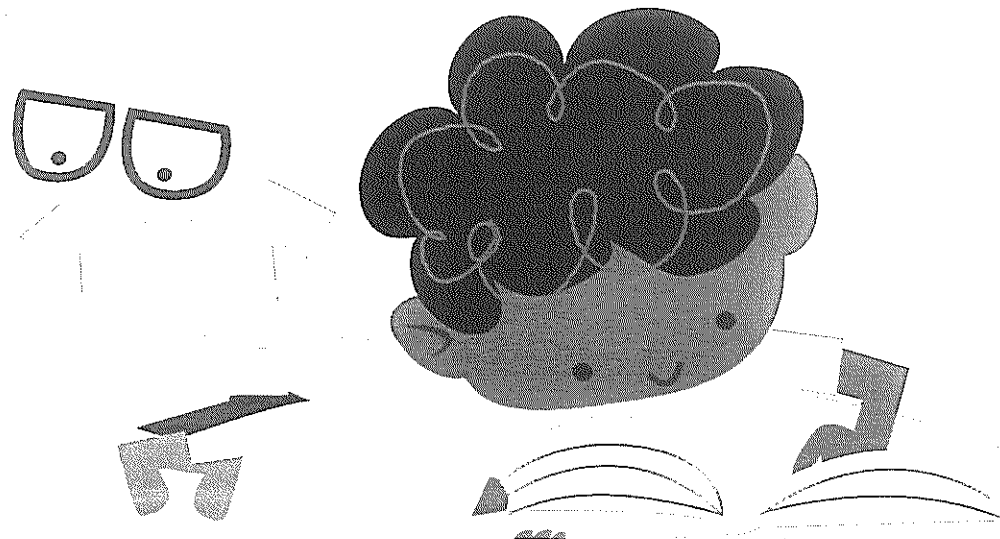
# Movies Are More Enjoyable Than Books

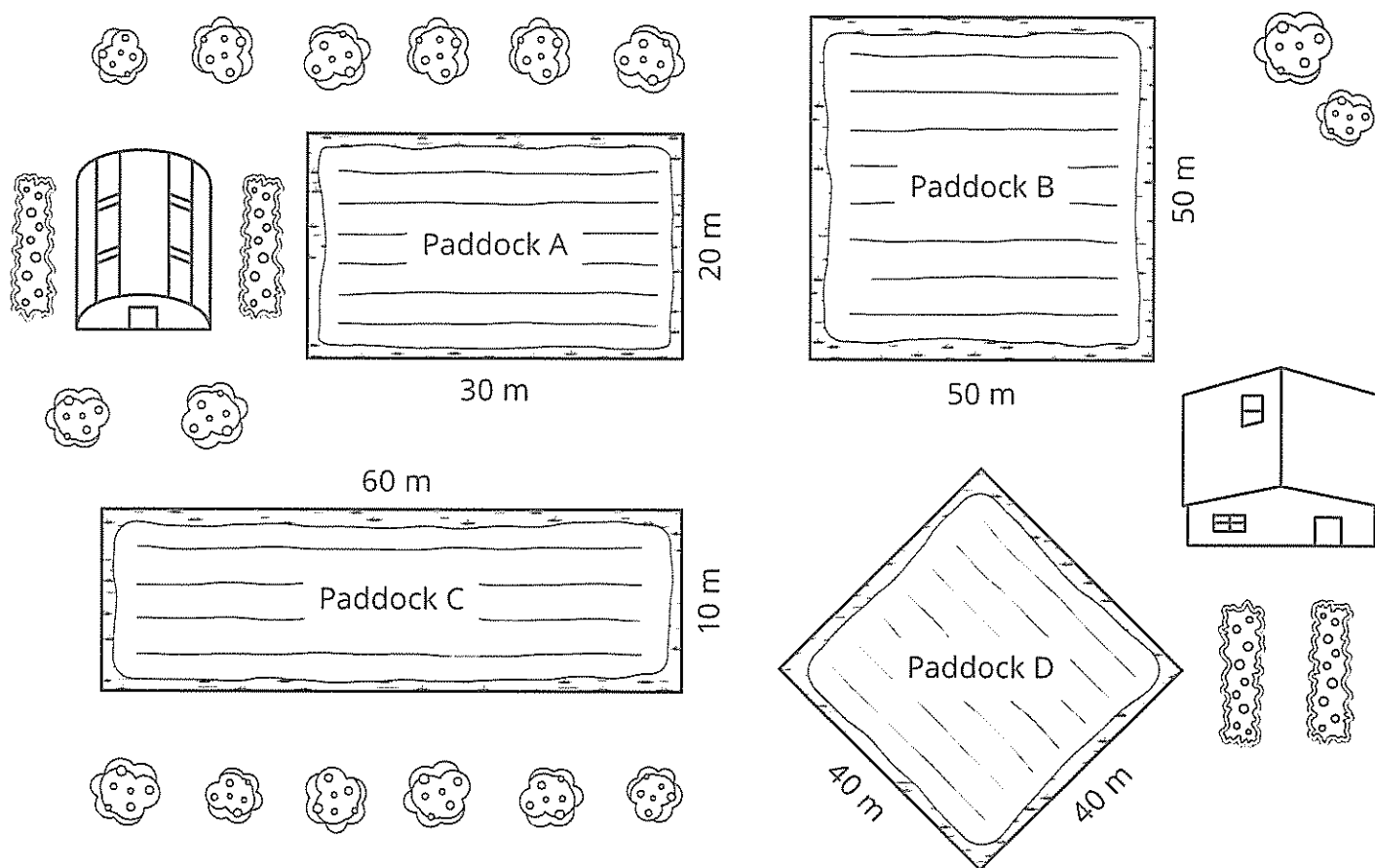

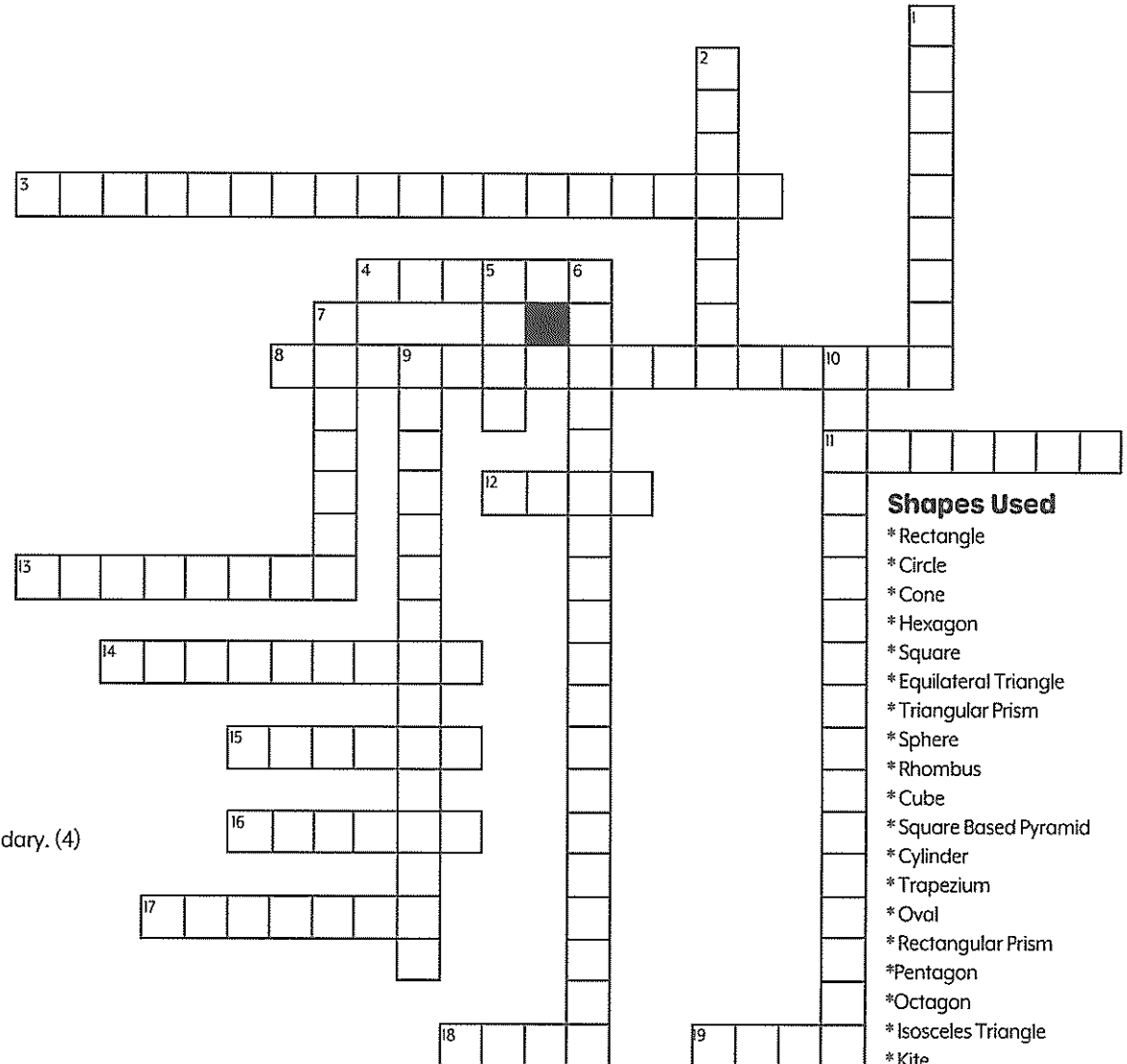
