If aliens are there, they are a long way from us.

Life on Mars?

In 1984, scientists found a piece of rock in Antarctica. But it was not just any old piece of rock. The rock was from Mars. It began its journey through space millions of years ago. Eventually, it collided with Earth and ended up in Antarctica.

Scientists are still sending spacecraft to Mars to continue the search for other life forms.

"Kitten," said Mouse.


"What?" said Mouse's mother. "You must never play with Kitten again. She's your enemy."
